At Colorado Plains Medical Center, our goal is to deliver the best healthcare available in the Morgan County area as we seek to make our community healthier. Delivering quality healthcare is a big part of the contribution we make. But there are many other ways a hospital can make a positive impact on the community it serves. Here are a few of the other ways we are making a difference.

Millions invested in capital improvements

In 2009, we will complete the first phase of our master facility plan including the installation of a new 1.5T MRI housed in a re-designed emergency department and imaging services area with improved access.

Our future plans also include the installation of digital mammography and the build-out of space in the medical office building to accommodate an internal medicine practice. We also plan to add new equipment, such as a laparoscopy tower.

A number of quality improvements to our state-of-the-art facility have been made that include opening of the first diagnostic cardiac cath lab in Northeast Colorado. Colorado Plains Medical Center also sports a new and convenient billing office and lab draw station in the admissions area and new flooring in our kitchen. In fact, last year we invested over \$2 million in our facility which, in addition to the above, included technology replacement, information technology additions/updates, and routine facility upkeep and maintenance.

Contributing to our local tax base

Last year, Colorado Plains Medical Center paid \$212,000 in taxes that have helped to support our city, county and state. These dollars help to support local schools, development of roads, recruitment of business and industry, and other needed services.

Helping those in need

Colorado Plains Medical Center provided over \$31.6 million in uncompensated care last year, which included the amounts not covered by government-sponsored programs such as Medicare and Medicaid. This amount includes \$4.5 million for charity care and bad debts, incurred as we cared for many people without sufficient resources.

Adding new physicians

During the past year, Colorado Plains Medical Center has added five new physicians to our highly respected medical staff, including specialists in Pediatrics, Internal Medicine, Psychiatry, Family Medicine and Radiology

With an annual payroll of \$13.7 million and 253 employees, Colorado Plains Medical Center is one of the largest employers in the region.
