At Lander Regional Hospital, our goal is to deliver the best healthcare available in the greater Fremont County area as we seek to make our community healthier. Over \$2.5 million invested last year

We invested over \$2.5 million in our facility last year which included technology replacement, information technology additions/updates, and routine facility upkeep and maintenance. And, we opened our brand new ambulatory (outpatient) surgery center, representing a multi-year investment of \$8.2 million. During this next year, we will acquire and install a new Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) system to better serve our community.

Contributing to our local tax base

Last year, Lander Regional Hospital paid \$180,525 in taxes that have helped to support our city, county and state. This included

sales taxes as well as property taxes. These dollars help to support local schools, development of roads, recruitment of business and industry, and other needed services.

Helping those in need

Lander Regional Hospital provided over \$32.4 million in uncompensated care last year, which included the amounts not covered by government-sponsored programs such as Medicare and Medicaid. This amount includes \$3.5 million for charity care and bad debts, incurred as we cared for many people without sufficient resources.

One of our community's major employers

Providing an annual payroll of over \$13.7 million with more than 200 employees, Lander Regional Hospital is one of the largest employers in the region.
