Over \$2.5 million in capital improvements

In 2008, we invested over \$2.5 million in our facility which included technology replacement, information technology additions/updates, and routine facility upkeep and maintenance.

In 2009, we completed a new MRI Suite and will begin the addition of our new Cardiac Cath Lab. We have also added Digital Mammography, the latest weapon in the fight against breast cancer, and made a number of other quality improvements to our state-of-the-art facility such as upgrading radiology and laboratory testing equipment.

Contributing to our local tax base

Last year, Logan Regional Medical Center paid \$2.1 million in taxes that have helped to support our city, county and state. This included sales taxes as well as property taxes. These dollars help to support local schools, development of roads, recruit-

ment of business and industry, and other needed services.

Helping those in need

Logan Regional Medical Center provided over \$137 million in uncompensated care last year, which included the amounts not covered by government-sponsored programs such as Medicare and Medicaid. This amount includes \$12.3 million for charity care and bad debts, incurred as we cared for many people without sufficient resources.

Adding to the medical staff

During the past year, Logan Regional Medical Center added a number of new physicians to our highly respected medical staff, including specialists in cardiology, general surgery and obstetrics/gynecology.

With an annual payroll of \$35.5 million and more than 730 employees, Logan Regional Medical Center is one of the largest employers in the region.
